GCH CH PACH Terracotta's Victor Newman MXP4 MXPB MJP2 T2BP2 owned by club member Karen Mikulin and co-owned with Karen Watson, earned his Preferred Agility Champion (PACH) on February 11th, 2018.



Victor will be 9 years old on the 9th of May and is Karen's first agility dog. They started agility training during the summer of 2013 and earned their first Novice titles in November 2014. They progressed through Open and Excellent and then made it to

Masters. Double Q's started compiling after September 2016, 20 are needed for a PACH in addition to 750 points. Karen's work schedule only allows her to trial on Sunday's and she often takes a break during the winter so it made for a slow accumulation of double Q's, but on February 11th the final double Q fell into place.

Victor also placed #6 overall Preferred Ridgeback on the Breed Power 10 website.

Victor runs at the 20" preferred height because he was already four years old when Karen decided to try agility, it was a journey that she knew would take a while, so to take it easy on him she opted to run him at the preferred height. As long as Victor remains strong and healthy, he and Karen will be going for PACH #2, which they're already accumulating points and double Q's towards.

When asked what her biggest challenge was during their career together Karen responded with the weaves, he does them, but never as fast as they think he should. A few words from Karen - "Victor is my first agility dog and by the help of our instructors, mainly Lotta Shafer, he earned his PACH! Victor is very consistent. I've had a lot to learn about handling and that still is a very big challenge! I love my agility class at YABTC and learn every week from my instructor and all of my classmates."

Lee Jackson Award

A tribute to Lee Jackson

Lee Jackson was one of the founding members of the Youngstown All-Breed Training Club. Before the club was established, several people met and trained their dogs at Pioneer Pavilion in Mill Creek Park. They later moved to the GF Hall on Logan Ave in

Youngstown to train. Lee spent many hours and much of his own money to keep the club active. He was known as "Mr.Youngstown All-Breed" and served as president of



YABTC for 18 years. Lee was also president of Mahoning Shenago Kennel Club.

Lee was and AKC judge and one of 13 people in the nation to receive the distinguished 1977 Midwest

D'Ambris award. Unfortunately, Lee passed away before he could receive the award.

Both Lee and his wife Kay competed in obedience with Dachshunds and Belgian Sheepdogs. Kay also was Trial Secretary for many years. They had three dogs titled as Companion dogs. Lee had a good sense of humor and had one of his wire haired Dachshunds registered with the name "DAMMIT".

In March of 1978, in honor of Lee Jackson, the first Lee Jackson Award was given in tribute of him and has become a yearly tradition of YABTC. This award is given to an outstanding and dedicated person who had served our club in honor of Lee Jackson.

This year's recipient of the Lee Jackson Award is:

Mike Coats Jr.

Mike has been very instrumental in getting the club where we are today in our new facility. Without a doubt we would not be in this great facility without all his work behind the scenes work dedicated to the planning and construction of our building. At trials she and Promise have dazzled their competition and audiences alike and achieved MACH 5 in five years. She has now turned her skills to training her new dog, Havoc and many of us have had the opportunity to observe his enthusiasm, drive and growing abilities on the course and their development as a team.

Rae has enjoyed the benefit of her husband Bill's equally strong dedication and contributions to the club and to agility. He has generously applied his talents alongside hers to instruct, course build, maintain equipment, transport equipment, you name it...so much of the stuff that Rae and Bill, alongside the many and much appreciated volunteers, accomplish to run this program.
